Summary: After failing the entrance exam for the high school he'd spent his whole life prepping for, mild-mannered student Yuugo Hachiken moves away from his suburban lifestyle and enrolls at Ooezo Agricultural High – often abbreviated as $Ezon\bar{o}$ – in the countryside after. mounting issues with his family finally hit a breaking point.

As he worries about his future and grapples with the direction of his life over the course of the series, he slowly beings to figure out the kind of person he wants to be, despite some initial struggles, and grows into an empathetic and compassionate individual. All the while struggling to understand the world he came from, the one he is now a part of, and how they both shape the person he is becoming.

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Why now: Silver Spoon tackles a lot of social, mental and economic issues teens and even young adults tend to struggle with today such as:

- Relocation/transplantation into a new social system/environment -This has become much more prevalent in today's globalized economy/society.
- Mental health strains that early adulthood has on people Whether that be the pressure of career choice, family relations/expectations, economic worries or the previously mentioned relocation/transplantation.
- How those strains influence choices that result in either the growth or stunting of a person's development.

In addition, the framing of this story around an agricultural community has an additional value when presenting it towards *Silver Spoon's* target demographic (young teens to young adults, 12 to 30 years of age). As is touched on in the show, our current society has become very displaced and out of touch from the farming communities in our country, even though they are such a pivotal backbone of any society. As someone who grew up in a farming community (though not a farmer myself) I was able to learn about the livelihood, culture and struggles of the farming community first hand. In doing so, I've gained an appreciation and understanding for a culture that most of modern society has either forgotten or chooses to ignore. I think the material has the ability to reconnect people to this missing side of society that exists as much in America as it is depicted in Japan. I feel this to be especially true as someone who discovered this piece after I'd left my home town and haing the material really resonate with me because of how much I saw that community and culture so accurately depicted in this show.

The manga is still ongoing. Meaning more seasons could be produced at a later date. At the time of the original production run, the second season had covered nearly all of the printed story.

The North American license of the manga is held by Yen Press.

The property's popularity spun a live action film made in 2014 by Toho.

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Audience Mobilization

The manga has sold over 15 million volumes in Japan as of 2014 and has over 16 million volumes in print since July 2017. It reached its first million in printed volumes only a year and three months after launch, the fastest for a Shogakukan title (published in *Weekly Shonen Sunday*).

Anieplex USA has 121 thousand Twitter followers, over 241 thousand Facebook followers and over 108 thousand Youtube subscribers. Not to mention their prevalence at anime conventions around the country.

The official Silver Spoon anime website has over 13 thousand likes.

Goose House, who performed the season 2 ending, has 2.1 million subscribers on Youtube.

Over 151 thousand people have engaged with/watched the show AND reported doing so on myanimelist.com (with 91 new viewers on the day this was written alone, February 14th 2018).

Yen Press has over 38 thousand Twitter followers and over 55 thousand Facebook likes.

Gin No Saji returns 12,200 Youtube search results and Silver Spoon Anime returns 16,100 results. This may seem small but is huge considering a lot of the content from the show, especially around the music, is heavily monitored and stricken from YouTube. The openings and endings are nearly unobtainable on Youtube but are so desired that the amount of covers are numerous. So this search result that is almost completely barren of actual show footage is impressive.

Potential brand integration:

Promotion/cross promotion with members of the National FFA Organization (Future Farmers of America). Was founded in 1928 and currently has over 650,000 members (grades 7 through college. Members/alumni who have aged out are not included in this count). Yearly national FFA convention/expo where teams across the country gather to learn and compete will be October 24th-27th this year in Indianapolis.

Yen Press is just starting to release the English adaptation of the manga volumes. Volume 1 releases February 27th, volume 2 April 24th and volume 3 June 12th. So its ripe to spark interest between both audiences to boost sales/viewership.

Reviews on Netflix have been very high for the show since its launch and still by new viewers today. Coupled with how accessible the platform is and how large of an audience they command between both casual and hardcore anime fans, it seems best to pursue a distribution deal through them for airing the show.




Yūgo Hachiken

Everything here is a pain and he feels lost, but that doesn't mean he isn't trying to be found. It's just hard to feel ok when everyone else seems to have their life together.

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


Aki Mikage

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


Ichirō Komaba

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


Shinnosuke Aikawa




Hajime Nishikawa




Yoshiyuki Nakajima
